- Viral load results of reportable diseases
- ALL blood lead levels, as of 12/2002 (KCLPPP/ABLES)
- CD4+ T-lymphocyte count < 500/  $\mu$ l or CD4+ T-lymphocytes <29% of total lymphocytes
